Becoming an MRCP(UK) PACES examiner

Are you interested in medical education and assessment?

We would like to welcome applications from new fellows to become PACES examiners. PACES examining makes a major contribution to postgraduate education, providing examiners with a chance to gain new skills, increase their subject range and to expand their professional network. It is also an opportunity to add an extra perspective to your career through gaining CPD points and adding to your revalidation portfolio.

What is involved?

The Practical Assessment of Clinical Examination Skills (PACES) consists of five 20-minute clinical stations designed to assess seven skills through a wide range of specialties. Examiners work in an 11-strong team to assess candidates in these skills in a hospital setting.

Being an examiner is not too time-consuming. Once approved and trained, examiners are expected to commit 2/3 days each year but are encouraged to participate more if possible. The exam runs in a variety of locations over a wide range of dates making it easy to fit examining into your schedule.
